



Typing the Quapaw (*Okáxpá*) Writing System

When typing *Okáxpá*, it is important to include the special characters and accents dictated by our writing system. These special characters are easily typed using a word processor by holding down the left **ALT** key on your keyboard then typing a character’s four- or three-number **ALT code**. For example, holding down **ALT** while sequentially typing **0, 2, 4, 3** produces the following character: **ó**.
